Exercise 4-7

Instructions: Identify which of the following are **arguments by analogy**, and which are only analogies.

1) Mattie's mind is a cave: deep, dark, and full of bats.

3) A concept is like a file folder in which we store information about a category of objects.

3) An experiment is a question put to nature and, like a lawyer cross-examining a witness, the scientist needs to know what answer he expects.

4) Like John F. Kennedy, Barack Obama is young, personable, and a Democrat. So, like Kennedy, he will be remembered by history.
